As 2024 comes to a close, we reflect on an extraordinary year for Tarrant County. Our dedicated team has worked tirelessly to ensure our community remains the best place to live, work, and raise a family. Together, we've celebrated remarkable achievements and laid the groundwork for an even brighter future.

### **Priority Achievements**

Here are some of the key milestones we've reached in 2024, showcasing our commitment to conservative principles of fiscal responsibility, public safety, and smart infrastructure development:

• Upgraded Sheriff's Fleet: We replaced over 40 vehicles for the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office, ensuring our deputies have safe and reliable vehicles to serve our community effectively. This investment underscores our commitment to law and order.



• Replaced HVAC System in Jail: We were able to complete the renovation of the Tarrant County Jail HVAC system under-budget and ahead of schedule. This allowed us to return 400 prisoners to Tarrant County from an outside facility and represented a cost savings of more than \$1 million.

• New Law Enforcement Training Center: Construction began on a state-of-the-art training facility to equip our law enforcement officers with world-class resources to protect and serve. This project reflects our dedication to supporting those who uphold our laws and keep our neighborhoods safe.

• First Armored Rescue Vehicle: For the first time in Tarrant County history, our SWAT Unit now has an Armored Rescue Vehicle, enhancing our response capabilities in critical situations and reaffirming our focus on public safety and preparedness.

• Road and Bridge Improvements: Our Precinct 4 Maintenance Department worked year-round, in all weather conditions, to keep our roads and bridges in top shape. Additionally, we assisted numerous partner cities with their roadway maintenance and rebuild projects, showcasing the incredible talent and dedication of our operators. These efforts ensure that we can consistently deliver the highest quality roads and bridges without the need for excessive spending.





### **Celebrating Growth and Progress**

This year, Tarrant County experienced exceptional growth, including the successful creation of more than 1,000 new jobs. These opportunities strengthen our economy and enhance the quality of life for residents across the county. In addition to the job growth, we made significant progress in planning and funding critical infrastructure projects. ### Silver Creek Azle Road Project Update

The reconstruction of Silver Creek Azle Road began the last week of August and is anticipated to be completed before the Christmas holiday.

This project encompasses over 2.5 miles of reconstructed roadway, representing a significant investment in the infrastructure of Precinct 4. By enhancing one of our major north-south thoroughfares, we aim to improve overall accessibility and safety for all residents and travelers in the area.

We acknowledge that construction may cause some temporary inconveniences for the residents nearby. However, upon



completion, we believe that community members will recognize the extent of the deterioration of the previous road and will truly value the enhancements that have been made.



# **Development in the North West**



Fort Worth City Council recently approved the purchase of nearly 200 acres for its open space conservation program, aiming to preserve natural ecosystems and protect water sources. This includes 152.5 acres of cross-timber forest and prairie near Silver Creek, and 38.2 acres in southwest Fort Worth, which features wetlands, prairie, and freshwater habitats.

The acquisitions align with Mayor Mattie Parker's "Good Natured" initiative, which aims to preserve 10,000 acres of green space by 2028, supported by private funding and a \$15 million bond passed in 2022. Since launching the program in 2019, Fort Worth has preserved over 1,000 acres to counter rapid urban development.

Fort Worth is losing 50 acres per week of natural open space to development, and the city's population is expected to grow by more than 270,000 people in the next 24 years. With that growth, more greenspace is needed to: protect water quality, enhance flood protection, and promote physical and mental health through recreation and opportunities to connect with the natural environment.

The City is working with Tarrant Regional Water District, Steams & Valleys, Oncor, and many other stakeholders through a 501(c)3 Conservancy to help with greenspace acquisition.

Future plans include a potential \$22.5 million bond in 2026 to fund further conservation efforts.

One of the program's highlights is the annual Youth and Government Conference, where students showcase their knowledge and skills




