CERVICAL CANCER IN TARRANT COUNTY

- From 2017-2021, there were 465 new cases of cervical cancer and 133
 deaths reported among Tarrant County women (age-adjusted incidence
 and mortality rates of 8.7 and 2.5 per 100,000 population respectively)
- According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, if detected early, cervical cancer is one of the most treatable cancers with a five-year relative survival rate of over 90% for the earliest stages
- In 2024, approximately 7 in 10, Tarrant County women aged 21 to 65 years
 received a Pap test in the past three years, meeting the United States
 Preventative Services Task Force guidelines for early detection of cervical cancer
- In 2024, 47% of Tarrant County women aged 18 to 45 years had ever received the HPV vaccine, which helps prevent cervical cancer

Figure 1. Cervical cancer incidence and mortality rates among selected geographic areas, 2017-2021






Figure 2. Cervical cancer incidence and mortality rates among Tarrant County women, 2012-2021

Risk factors for cervical cancer include

- Human papillomavirus (HPV) infection
 HPV Vaccines are highly effective at preventing
 HPV infection [cdc.gov/vaccines/vpd/hpv/hcp/vaccines]
- Smoking
- Weakened immune system
- Use of birth control pills for 5+ years
- Birth to 3+ children
- Sex before age 18, sex with multiple partners, and sex with someone who has had multiple partners
- Having a family history of cervical caner
