Week 34 Summary

- 169 mosquito pools* have been tested in NTRL from week
 - Year-to-date NTRL has tested a total of 3479 mosquito pools
- 51 mosquito pools tested positive for WNV this week:
 - Arlington (3) Bedford (1) Benbrook (1) Burleson* (10) Crowley (2) DFW Airport (1) Euless (2) Fort Worth* (15) Grand Prairie* (2) Keller (1) Mansfield (4) North Richland Hills (3) Southlake (2) Unincorporated (3) Watauga (1)
- There have been 0 imported human cases of SLE or Zika in 2024. There have been <5 cases of Dengue Fever. There have been 42 human cases of West Nile disease.
- Average number of mosquitoes/trap include:



Figure 1. Average Number of Female *Culex* Species Per Trap and Vector Index by Collection Date, Tarrant County, 2023-2024


